



The Erring Burn is a small but stunning tributary of the River North Tyne with alternating vegetated and open sections characterised by a mix of deep water pools and fast narrow riffles. Challenging fishing in the North Tyne valley overlooked by Hadrian's Wall.

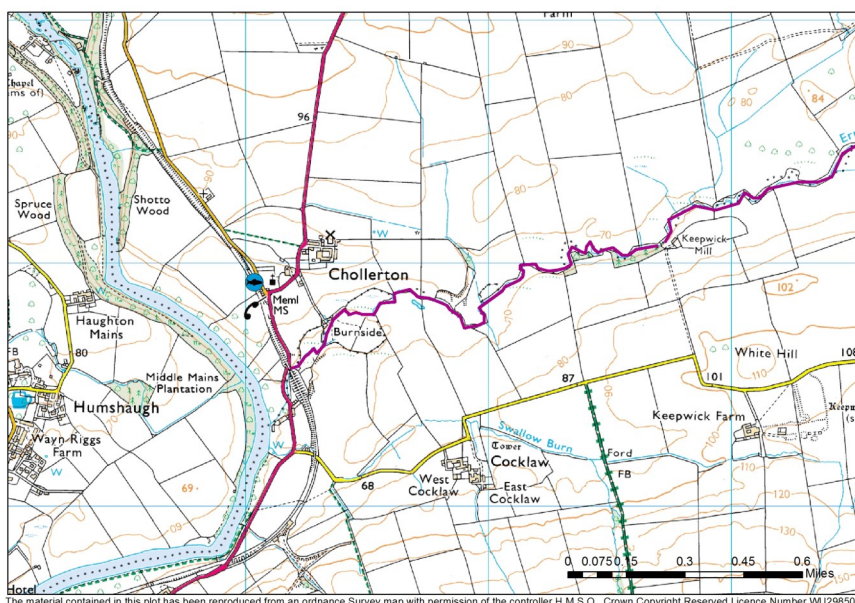
