



# Houghton Castle Trout

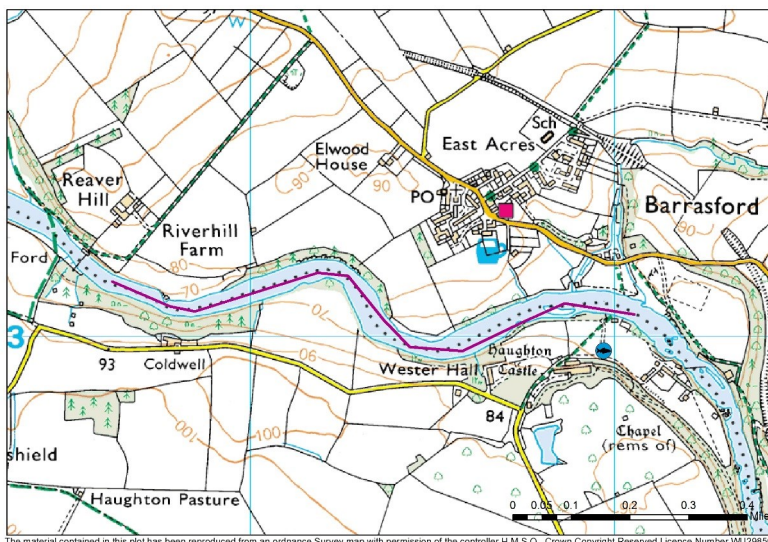
The North Tyne, one of the 2 sources of the River Tyne, is famous as a salmon river. Downstream of Kielder dam it flows through beautiful countryside. Houghton Castle is one of the premier fishing beats on the North Tyne. The Passport beat is from The Long Rack down to Ferrymans Cottage at Houghton Castle. With good holding water between fast streams this is a very interesting beat, offering good stocks of wild brown trout. This is an exceptional opportunity to fish a very private quality beat.

<b>Length of fishing</b>	2 km
<b>Species permitted</b>	Brown Trout
<b>Period available</b>	22nd March—22nd April
<b>Rules</b>	Fly only. Catch and release. No dogs or picnics. Close all gates
<b>Banks included</b>	Right bank
<b>Max. no of anglers</b>	4
<b>Upstream limit</b>	The Rack, end of wood at ford
<b>Downstream limit</b>	Ferrymans Cottage
<b>Where to park</b>	Anglers Car park near the rack or Ferrymans Cottage
<b>Wading difficulty</b>	Stick and buoyancy aid recommended
<b>Other information</b>	Accommodation available (email braithwaite@ukonline.co.uk)
