



Rochester

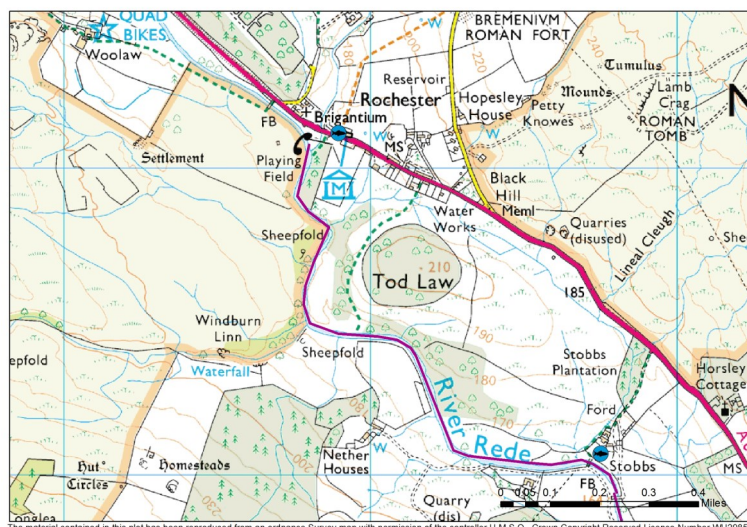
The River Rede is the major tributary of the River North Tyne running from the reservoir at Catcleugh through the wilds of northern Northumberland, the border country and National Park before finally reaching the North Tyne at Redesmouth. This is a fantastic, and rare, opportunity to fish some of the Catchment's best water on a day ticket. The beat from Rochester down to the road bridge at Stobbs Farm has a good mix of easy-hard fishing but is predominantly open and fast flowing.

Rules	Fly only. Catch and release.
Banks included	Left only
Max. no of anglers	2
Upstream limit	Café at Rochester
Downstream limit	Stobbs Farm road bridge
Where to park	Brigantium car park
Wading difficulty	Moderate (fairly shallow)
Other information	Refreshments at Camien Café in Rochester

Directions:

Take the A68 through Rochester. Park in the car park opposite Camien Café. Walk north up a68 and turn left over stile before bridge over burn.
