The North Tyne, one of the two sources of the River Tyne, is famous as a Salmon river. Flowing downstream from Kielder dam, its course carries it through beautiful countryside. This is a beautiful location with some excellent fishing.

Right bank—The fence line upstream of the Riverdale Hall Hotel

Downstream limit

Right bank—The end of the small wood on the right bank

Where to park

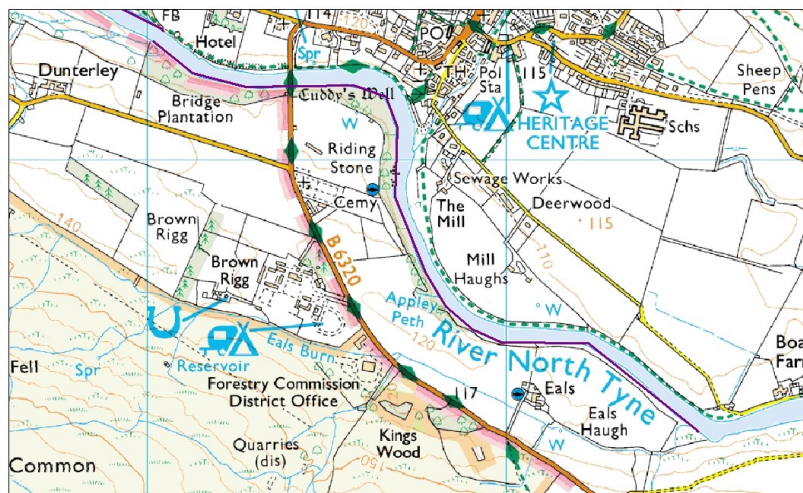
Park on the grass in the farm yard, not in the turning circle. Access is between the black shed on the left and the sheep pens on the right. Close all gates and follow fence to the river(200m) where there is a small gate on the right, some 25m past the field gate.
