

To reach the left bank, turn off the B6320 just north of Bellingham bridge onto the C200 Kielder road and proceed for 1.5km. To park on the opposite bank turn first right south of Bellingham bridge, signed for 'Kielder Organic Meats' and two National Cycle routes.
